Ashley and Broomhill Community Council Report

This report covers progress we have made in dealing with your priorities for the Ashley and Broomhill Community Council area during December 2022.

The report aims to highlight emerging issues in your area, and to provide crime prevention advice and guidance to Community Council members and residents you represent. Our focus is to reduce crime and disorder, help create safer communities and respond effectively to local concerns.

As I continue to say at every meeting, this area is very safe for all that reside and work here, and by remaining vigilant we can keep it like that.

Community Policing Priorities

Antisocial behaviour, Violence and Disorder:

There has been no reports of Anti-Social behaviour, Violence or disorder in this area this month.

Acquisitive Crime:

On the 5th of Jan, there was a report regarding the theft of a Catalytic converter from a car parked in Norfolk Road, as the resident was elderly and the car was used infrequently there was no time frame for when this occurred. There was a spate of them in the last quarter of 2022, which were predominantly in the North of the city, and there were no other reports in the area. This enquiry has been added to the scime series and is being progressed by Proactive CID Unit.

Again this month there have been reports of Broadband salesmen going door to door, there appears to be no crimes occurred, as the ones that have been stopped have all been legitimate.....however I would reassure the members that residents should contact the police if they have any concerns.

A theft by shoplifting occurred on the morning of 13 Jan, a member of staff was distracted within the Sainsbury's store, when a school age youth, went behind the counter and stole a quantity of vapes. Enquiries have been made at the schools but there no one has been identified.

Road Safety & Road Crime:

During the early evening of the 5th there was a report of a female being struck from behind by a car. This occurred in the lane running parallel to the rear of Great Western

Road, the female rolled over the bonnet and was luckily unhurt. The young male driver stopped to make sure the female was ok, before driving on. It would appear he was going the wrong way down the lane as one end has a no entry sign. The vehicle is described as a small blue car possibly a fiesta. No registration was noted by the female.

During rush hour on the 12th, there was a 2 vehicle collision on Broomhill Road, it was of a minor nature and both drivers exchanged details. They called Police to inform them of the collision and advise that the road would be clearing. On this occasion the Police non-attendance criteria was met and there was no police involvement

Throughout the month, Roads Policing Units carry out proactive patrols, during which they identified a car on Pitstruan Place, for having no MOT or insurance, the vehicle was seized and the driver reported.

Community Engagement & Reassurance

Whilst the above gives you a flavour of what the Local Policing Team are doing in your area and focus on the Policing priorities, there are a number of sections which are not regularly shared. These cover personal incidents, where we are not at liberty to share these details. In the community council area this month there have been over 40 calls in total with around a third being Concern Calls, Missing People or requests to assist members of the Public, where members of the public are requiring assistance for incidents which have no criminality.

On these occasions we work closely with our partners in NHS Grampian and the Scottish Ambulance Service to provide support and reassurance and sign post the individual to the most appropriate service.
