



Ashley and Broomhill Community Council Report

This report covers progress we have made in dealing with your priorities for the Ashley and Broomhill Community Council area during November 2022.

The report aims to highlight emerging issues in your area, and to provide crime prevention advice and guidance to Community Council members and residents you represent. Our focus is to reduce crime and disorder, help create safer communities and respond effectively to local concerns.

Community Policing Priorities

Antisocial behaviour, Violence and Disorder:

Officers continue to carry out patrols across the Community Council area relying on members of the public contacting us to report any anti-social or disorderly behaviour.

A red van was damaged on Broomhill Avenue, and appeared to have been keyed across several panel. A positive line of enquiry is ongoing and appears to have been a targeted incident as there are no other reports of damage in the street.

Acquisitive Crime:

There has been a number of crimes in this category this month.

On the 4th, there was a Carrera mountain bike stolen from within a secure shed on Irvine Place, and there was a break in to storage boxes at Thorngrove Court on the 12th, where a number of parcels was stolen. There is nothing linking these crimes, but we encourage the public to report any suspicious activity

Both these incidents don't have specific timeframes, so are unlikely to be detected.

Unfortunately Shoplifting also appears to be in the rise in the area, with several being reported

Sainsbury and Iceland on Holburn Street have both reported an increase in thefts of meat and alcohol, with CCTV capturing the suspect, and positive lines of enquiry are progressing.

Road Safety & Road Crime:

A number of low level collisions in the area this month, which is replicated across the division and is common in the darker nights

On the 3rd of November there was a collision at the junction of Holburn Street and Great Western Road, this was reported to police for information only, as there was luckily no injury to the motorbike rider.

On the 7th there was another low level collision between 2 vehicles, the non-attendance policy dictated that police didn't need to attend as again there was no injury and all parties involved exchanged details

On the 13th, a black Range Rover parked on Great Western Road, was struck by a small red car, the driver unfortunately drove off without leaving details, thankfully a member of the public came forward and passed details and the driver was traced.

At the end of the month, a member of public reported a suspicious male sleeping within a car on Pitstruan Place, on Police attendance it was discovered that the car was stolen and being driven on false plates. The driver was arrested for several offences. This was excellent call from a member of the public who believed that it just didnt seem right and shared his suspicions.

Concerns regarding parking around Ashley Road School continue, especially regarding the parking in double yellow lines. This has been passed to Aberdeen City Council Community Wardens, who enforce the parking restrictions, and Police Scotland will be looking to work with them to encourage responsible parking for the safety of the children attending the school.

We continue to work with partners in response to specific complaints in terms of road traffic offences and road safety. Residents in the areas affected by antisocial driving are encouraged to contact Police on 101 at the time, to report incidents and provide as much description as possible of the vehicle(s)/person(s) in order for us to take positive action.
